The Caribbean Public Health Agency (CARPHA), a Public Health Agency serving 24 member states in the Caribbean, headquartered in Trinidad and Tobago has received financing in the amount equivalent to US \$800,000 from the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB), and it intends to apply part of the proceeds to payments for consulting services to be procured under the Regional Tourism Health Information, Monitoring and Response Systems and Standards to Enhance Sustainable Tourism Project. Bidding will be governed by the Inter-American Development Bank's eligibility rules and procedures.

The main objective of this three year project is to improve participating countries'¹ capacity to provide cost effective and quality health, food safety and environmental sanitation solutions to Health, Safety and Environmental Sanitation (HSE) threats impacting on sustainable tourism in the Caribbean, by developing: (i) a regional tourism health information, surveillance and monitoring and response system (THMRS); (ii) a set of credible Caribbean-wide HSE tourism standards with accompanying certification schemes; and (iii) a training program to build capacity in food safety and environmental sanitation.

CARPHA now invites applications from eligible individuals for the following positions at the Project Implementation Unit for the Regional Tourism Health Information, Monitoring and Response Systems and Standards to Enhance Sustainable Tourism:

Epidemiologist /Technical Operations Officer

The consultant will provide oversight for the technical operations of the regional tourism and health project including undertaking routine epidemiologic and surveillance functions for the establishment and operation of a national and regional Tourism Health Monitoring & Response System as part of the overall public health surveillance system of the tourism-dependent Caribbean countries. This consultant will also provide technical input in the development of health and environmental standards. Results of technical work in this area aids in the monitoring of health status and its correlation, identification of trends or disease outbreaks or other adverse health events, and providing data and information about corrective actions or programs to promote and protect public health.
